AMRRIC supports <u>desexing</u> and dog health programs to improve the situation for dogs, their owners and communities. By improving the health and welfare of companion animals, AMRRIC contributes to improved <u>community health</u>.

AMRRIC works with a range of stakeholders and partners. It trains locally employed animal management workers, provides education programs and supports research into disease and disease prevention

AMRRIC is a non-profit organisation based in <u>Darwin</u>, <u>Northern Territory</u>, operating nationally across Australia. AMRRIC receives funding from the Australian Federal Government's <u>Department of Families</u>, <u>Housing</u>, <u>Community Services and Indigenous Affairs</u> and from the <u>Northern Territory Government</u>, and also relies on private and <u>philanthropic</u> donations.
